

**South Cambridgeshire and Cambridge City Councillor Round Table
Monday 13th June 2022 via Microsoft Teams**

Police and Crime Commissioner, Darryl Preston held a virtual Round Table for South Cambridgeshire and Cambridge City councillors on Monday 13th June.

This was Darryl's third round of regular meetings with Councillors and provided an opportunity for local issues to be discussed.

Darryl began by welcoming those Councillors attending and updated attendees on progress against his Police and Crime Plan 2021-24 (published in November 2021).

Other issues raised by Councillors included:

- Whether young people are represented on the Commissioner's Independent Scrutiny Panel and Independent Custody Scheme;
- What the latest update is on Parkside Police Station and the proposed new station in Milton;
- How councillors can help support the Constabulary to communicate with local residents; about positive action on issues such as anti-social behaviour and drug dealing;
- Illegal parking and driving – what more can be done to support local residents;
- How the Constabulary can update councillors on changes of officers in Neighbourhood Teams.

The Commissioner agreed to the following actions:

- An open invitation for councillors to invite him into their communities to meet residents and discuss local issues;
- Individual meetings with councillors to discuss how to improve diversity within volunteering;
- A commitment to update councillors once it is confirmed where the new Cambridge City Centre police station will be located;
- A commitment to support the Constabulary to update councillors about changes in personnel and share updates on positive police action;
- To share details about a new Road Safety post funded through the Commissioner's office.

Mr Preston is committed to running these virtual events and dates will be circulated for the next round in the new year.
