Good afternoon,

Thank you for your response.

Can the Town Council please respond specifically regarding any objections to the proposed names. I have decided to e-mail you an official consultation (below) for clarity.

As you will be aware there is a new development taking place on the above site, and street names will be required for the access roadways.

The following names have been proposed and I can see no reason for objection. I would, however, be grateful for any comments your authority may wish to make. If you wish to object to the proposal then the grounds must be reasonable and objective, (e.g. that the proposed name would cause confusion because of similarity to an existing name). Case law has shown that an objection made simply because the proposed names are thought to be unpopular, or unsuitable are not valid grounds for objection.

Larkspur

Please see below the developer's reason for the names:

*The names noted above are all wildflowers. The scheme forms part of the Northstowe township which makes references to its attempts to enhance biodiversity and creating green corridors as part of the development. The scheme has shown gardens of wild flowers and Bee hotels and ties in with the Northstowe statement taken from their website which is as follows:*

*Both its open spaces and buildings are conceived to enhance biodiversity, creating green corridors all around that link to the wider Cambridgeshire area. It will support a low carbon community lifestyle with buildings that use less energy, provide carbon savings and are economic to run. It will also have fibre optic connectivity, great public transport, cycle lanes, walkways and electric vehicle charging points.*

*Northstowe is dedicated to protecting and enhancing biodiversity by creating green corridors that link to the wider landscape and which provide a place for people to enjoy and relax. In fact, it is the landscape and green infrastructure of the natural land in and around Northstowe that has helped inform the layout of the town, integrating both green spaces and waterways into the mix for people to enjoy and relax in.*

Legislation dictates that your authority's comment or objections are required within **14 days of the date of this letter**. Should they not be received within that timescale I will be obliged to proceed with the naming without you.
