Candidate 1- Hunter, I.

- I want to serve the community, to help it to grow into an example for other new towns and developments.
- I am a retired F.E Manager/Lecturer and have been involved in delivering courses for shop Stewards, via the TUC to help them deal with the media (press, media & TV) so could train the Council Members.

Candidate 2- Cattaneo, M.

- I am deeply committed to enhancing the well-being of our community and believe that as a councillor, I can effectively represent and address the needs of us residents.
- As a consulting director, I have been working in multicultural environments, for very large corporations, to deliver innovative solutions and help transforming their business, nationally and internationally.

- I would like to work in developing and managing realistic plans and achieve measurable results for our community in the least possible time and in the most effective way, proactively managing risks that could undermine development programs.

Candidate 3- Talakalakoppa, S.

Hi,

I'm **Sandeep Talakalakoppa**, been resident of Northstowe since July 2021. I was born and brought up in Bangalore, India (India's Silicon Valley), and may be due to this, my educational background is Science. I have a master's degree in Microelectronics and have worked/ been working in related Tech companies (Intel, Arm, Broadcom ETC) for more than 15 years now.

Personally, I would not associate myself with any ideologies like capitalism, conservative, liberal, socialist or communist. There are good and bad things in each of these. I prefer to think (and what I learned from my educational and work experience) that there is no perfect system or ideology, and things can always be improved.

From what I've seen happening in Northstowe over last few years, some things were not planned properly, and some things went wrong due to not executing in a timely manner. Having said all that, Northstowe is a vibrant community, people are nice and welcoming here.
