- To receive a report with prospective candidates' information who have applied for the four casual vacancies of Town Councillor, following the uncontested elections on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2022.
- To receive presentations from candidates present at the meeting, for a maximum of 2 minutes each.
- To vote on who are to be co-opted as Town Councillors, in accordance with the resolution passed under item 55/22-23(3) and the Town Council's Co-Option Policy.
- For those candidates voted in who are present and wish to join as a Councillor straight away, to sign their Declaration of Acceptance of Office and join the Councillors at the meeting.

## **Background**

Following the uncontested elections on 5<sup>th</sup> May 2022, the Town Council's number of Councillors reduced from 15 to 11.

At the 11th May 2022 Council meeting (item 39/22-23) the Council decided to co-opt to fill these vacancies.

At its meeting on 25<sup>th</sup> May 2022, a Co-option Policy with updated co-option application form were approved by the Council (item 55/22-23), following which promotion of the Councillor vacancies took place.

The Town Council has received five applications from prospective candidates.

Initial checks have been made on eligibility, based on the information supplied by the applicants, and all are deemed eligible to stand for co-option.
